One perspective will be to revisit how the world went from the failure to agree in Copenhagen 2009 to the much appreciated agreement in Paris 2015 and its implementation (mostly) in Katowice 2018. We will also have a look at the next steps that need to be taken to reach the Paris goals in an equitable way.

In the second part of the symposium we will move into the Klimahaus exhibition to talk about actually visible and tangible impacts of climate change all over the world and especially in the places the Klimahaus journey is about. In addition to a scientific view on new developments in climate change and climate research, climate change witnesses from around the world will talk about how they experience climate change at home.
