On the occasion of the 21st meeting of the Adaptation Fund Board, the Adaptation Fund NGO Network hosted by Germanwatch will organise a one-day conference aiming to bring together a number of experts from governments, civil society, academia to discuss current challenges and approaches to address adaptation. Particular emphasis will be on the linkages between food security and adaptation, adaptation in cities in developing countries, and opportunities, challenges and lessons learnt of greater developing country ownership through direct access. The experience related to the Adaptation Fund as one important funding instrument on adaptation will receive particular attention, including through the involvement of civil society members of the AF NGO Network from South Africa, Cambodia, Benin, Jamaica, Senegal, Tanzania, Kenya and Honduras.

Key envisaged outcomes include

- an improved understanding of the challenges of climate change in the food security context, and potential approaches for adaptation;
- an improved understanding of adaptation options and challenges in major cities in developing countries;
- enhanced clarity on challenges and opportunities related to direct access;
- increased understanding of the role of the Adaptation Fund in promoting adaptation in poor developing countries;
- increased linkages between actors working on climate change adaptation and finance, and food security and challenges in cities.
